#### **MY STORY**

The Sunday tour of San Francisco was great, beautiful weather, excellent club attendance, interesting route, and wonderful seeing club members again. Unfortunately, my truck suffered a **breakdown** after our stop at the Palace. While we were staging for photos of the



attending cars in front of the Golden Gate Bridge, great volumes of smoke billowed up from under my

truck, and the engine stalled. Several members jumped out, brandishing fire extinguishers which fortunately were not needed as the smoke stopped and there were no flames. However, the truck was disabled, and I called AAA for a tow.

The tour moved on to the lunch spot while Marilyn and waited for the tow.



What followed was a massive failure of the AAA dispatching system but we finally got home with the truck at 7PM. Huge thanks to Charlie and Cynthia Drechsler for returning to us after lunch, enduring the long wait and helping with the AAA communications. We were not allowed to ride in the tow truck due to COVID concerns, the Drechslers drove us, following the tow truck, all the way to our house. They went well beyond the call of duty to help us out, we owe them big time.

With the truck in my shop, I figured out what happened. It has a starter button on the floorboard. A small set screw backed out and when I started it up, the button jammed down keeping the starter engaged! I didn't notice the stuck button, or the starter noise (how did I miss that?). During the photo maneuvers, the starter finally overheated, smoked, and then melted the windings, stopping the motor. The starter relay was still activated, disabling all the electrical accessories which made the situation seem worse than it was. Inspection of the wiring showed no damage, a new starter has been ordered which should bring everything back to life. I have unjammed the starter switch and the set screw now has Loctite holding it. Hope that will prevent a recurrence.
