MPOTAC BOARD MEETING

Nov.22,2021

The meeting was called to order at 7:34 by president Charlie Drechsler. There were 11 members present. Charlie had three handouts to be reviewed by the board. First thing he addressed was to conduct the meetings using the agenda that is set up in the by-laws and have a printout for each meeting. Charlie went over a list of things that he wants to accomplish during his presidency this coming year; such as Friendship Day and several ideas for a variety of tours that will have something foreveryone, he also handed out a spread sheet with a suggested itinerary for the year. Friendship Day will be our biggest event and we will need many members participating to make it run smoothly. Bob Moll has been in contact with 3 Lagoon to secure our usual site but it will depend on them completing their renovation in time for our use which is May 15th, 2022. Charlie suggested using the Port of RC but it was pointed out that there is only half the parking that 3 Lagoon has and would probably not work.

Facebook was another suggestion. None of these three places charge for the use of there space. Bob Moll will work on completing the F. D flyer design that Kathleen Lorist has set up. Jim Remington will need volunteers to help with the parking.

Membership: Bill Mitchell reported we have 80 registered members. There will be a new roster printedthis year and explained the process he uses to keep the membership list current. Members have through Feb to pay their dues to be included in the roster. Bill mentioned that he has a slush fund that he uses for expenses incurred for printing. Dues collected from new members at F. D. will be good through the following year.

Treasurers report: Ted Panofsky reported that this is the end of the fiscal year. There is \$2,324.29 in checking, \$14,803.35 in savings, \$117.31 in cash for a total of \$17,244.95.

Publications: Len Flaherty and Jim Remington wrote the last newsletter together and now Jim will take over as editor. Jim is bringing back the name of Windshield Post, publishing it every other month. Jim also suggested that the meeting minutes be published in the newsletter or sent out via e-mail or snail mail for members to review before the meeting to eliminate the reading of them at the meeting.

Web Master: This position should be included in the by-laws.

Ed Wong read the Oct 18th board meeting minutes and they were approved.

Charlie Drechsler brought up the topic of inviting guest speakers who could give us informative talks about car related subjects for our meetings and it was recommended that we have another car inspection event.

It was discussed whether we should raise the dues or not as they have not been raised for a number of years. But instead of raising them this year Bill Mitchell will add a flyer to the dues renewal asking for donations instead.

Bob Moll reported that the Highlands Club has lost a lot of members and maybe some of our members could join so they can keep it solvent. Their dues are \$20.00 a year.
