Amy Boggs from the ACS has provided the following information about the event:

Location: Burgess Park, parking lot on Alma closest to Burgess Drive. There are 20-30 spaces—I'll get an exact count. We will block off the entrance to that area around midday so as to let it clear out, and then we will admit your cars only. There are some trees for shade and you can also bring pop ups and chairs.

Food: we solicit donations from local businesses and set up snacks and coffee. And generally the firefighters bring dinner at 6pm. Teams also bring their own snacks/drinks. I'll have lemonade for a small donation.

Timing: Check-in and on-site registration starts at 1pm. Opening ceremony is at 2pm. We will have at least one band. The participants walk laps that will go right by your parking area. Raffle 5pm and Dinner 6pm. Luminaria ceremony at dusk (sunset is 6:55 that day). I suggest you get the cars there between 1pm and 2pm, and I understand most people like to get them home before dark.
